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Craig Barclay

Craig qualified BDS in 1986 from Glasgow, and took up his current NHS consultant post at Manchester in 2002. He is also Honorary Professor in Maxillofacial Rehabilitation and Associate Dental Postgraduate Dean for Specialist Training. He has published over 30 refereed papers, written three books and has lectures both nationally and internationally.

He is currently Director of the MSc implant programme at the University of Manchester, Director of Education of Manchester Dental Education Centre (Mandec) and is a past President 2009-2010 for the British Society of Prosthodontics (BSSPD).



Beth Burns

Beth Qualified in 2004 and undertook Vocational then General Professional Training and Masters in Science prior to entering Specialist training in Restorative Dentistry. She was appointed as a Consultant in Restorative Dentistry at Glasgow Dental Hospital and School in 2016 and is the lead for development of the Adult Dental Trauma Service in Greater Glasgow and Clyde.

Peter Day

Peter qualified from Bristol in 1997. He spent two years in general practice and hospital dentistry in Newcastle and a further year in Bolton as a senior house officer in oral and maxillofacial surgery. He started his specialist and academic training in Paediatric Dentistry in 2000 and has been in Leeds ever since. His PhD was in the field of dental trauma. In 2009, he spent six-month sabbatical working at the Royal Children's Hospital, Melbourne. He returned to England in January 2010 to take up a joint academic appointment with University of Leeds and Bradford Community Dental Service. He is an author of the latest IADT guidelines as well as contributing to UK and European guidelines, Cochrane reviews, national e-learning teaching tutorials and 20+ peer-reviewed dental traumatology publications.
